

## Environment and mobility measures improving, but cars still prominent.


## **MOBILITY**


- Walk, bike, and transit scores are higher in Lawrenceville than city average, except in Upper Lawrenceville (bike and transit)
- 40% of commuters in Lower and Central Lawrenceville do not use a car
- Declining transit ridership has not recovered from pandemic
- 1 out of 20 residents has a physical disability
- Healthy Ride's 8 Lawrenceville stations (now 3 POGOH) supported 10,000 rides in 2021, a 20% increase from 2020
- Spin had 17,000 rides from July–March

## **ENVIRONMENT**

- **Energy Consumption:** 22% decrease in industrial and 16% decrease in residential 2019–2021
- 425 customers were self-enrolled with suppliers that only offer a 100% renewable energy mix
- **Smog levels** in exceedance of federal standard twice in 2020
- Tree Canopy is 23%, as compared to 42% city-wide
- Greenspace: Upper Lawrenceville has least at just 0.3 acres
