## Theme #1: COMMUNITY - PUBLIC BENEFITS

The category focuses on the people, diversity, and quality of life in Lawrenceville.



Increase safe and inclusive spaces accessible to all community members such as arts center, activity center, or small community event space.

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Prioritize uses that benefit the community and support the needs of Lawrenceville's most marginalized residents.

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Calculate the vibrancy of the neighborhood with public art incorporated into public spaces and buildings.

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Retain some uses on the site that support community health such as a free air quality monitoring station or family health center.

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## Theme #2: CONNECTIVITY - ACCESSIBILITY

The category focuses on how people move around and move through the area of Lawrenceville.



Make the open spaces on the site accessible and welcoming to the public.

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Connect the site to Grand Park with new accessible and green pedestrian connections from Park Row.

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Calculate the future's potential and include the enhancing pedestrian access into the site.

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Support pedestrian safety enhancements to the intersections of 700 and 800 Streets.

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Prioritize and support future users accessing the site by transit, cycling and walking.
